Lucas will spend the summer in the Philippines connecting with locals through basketball. Katie will spend a week in Guatemala at Agua Viva Children's Home evangelizing through VBS and serving the organization.

As a Teaching Church focused on community and mission, we hope to empower people of all ages to make disciples and find their place in Christ. Lucas and Katie have both been impacted by the investment of church members and staff.

She already teaches ESL to Spanish and Ethiopian refugees at Centro Hispano here in Knoxville, and she hopes to one day teach ESL full-time wherever God sends her.

Lucas is also a rising senior who will graduate with a journalism degree next spring. He is completing his senior communication internship here at First Baptist in the fall, and he'll be working with our Communication and Media Coordinator, Rachel Bell, to apply his schooling through writing, design, film, and photography.


