

## THE FELLOWSHIP OF THE BELIEVERS

n the Book of Acts we see the church as it should be. They devoted themselves to emulating Christ through worshipping and praying together, helping those in need, learning and teaching, and hospitality. As a result, the number of believers increased daily.

Following the example of the early church, we have identified four areas of ministry each church should live out – worship, mission, discipleship, and community. We call these Kingdom Values.

This booklet describes what we believe about each of these four areas of ministry and details how you can get involved.

#### ACTS 2:42-47

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles.

All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need.

Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people.

And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.
