PRAYER REQUEST FROM MARC & KIM WYATT, CBF Advocates for Internationals, Research Triangle, NC

Pray for Win Maung, a leader of the Karen Baptist Fellowship of the Ridge Road Baptist Church, Win and his congregation of 80 were resettled to Raleigh several years ago by Lutheran Family Services.
