Becoming a Member

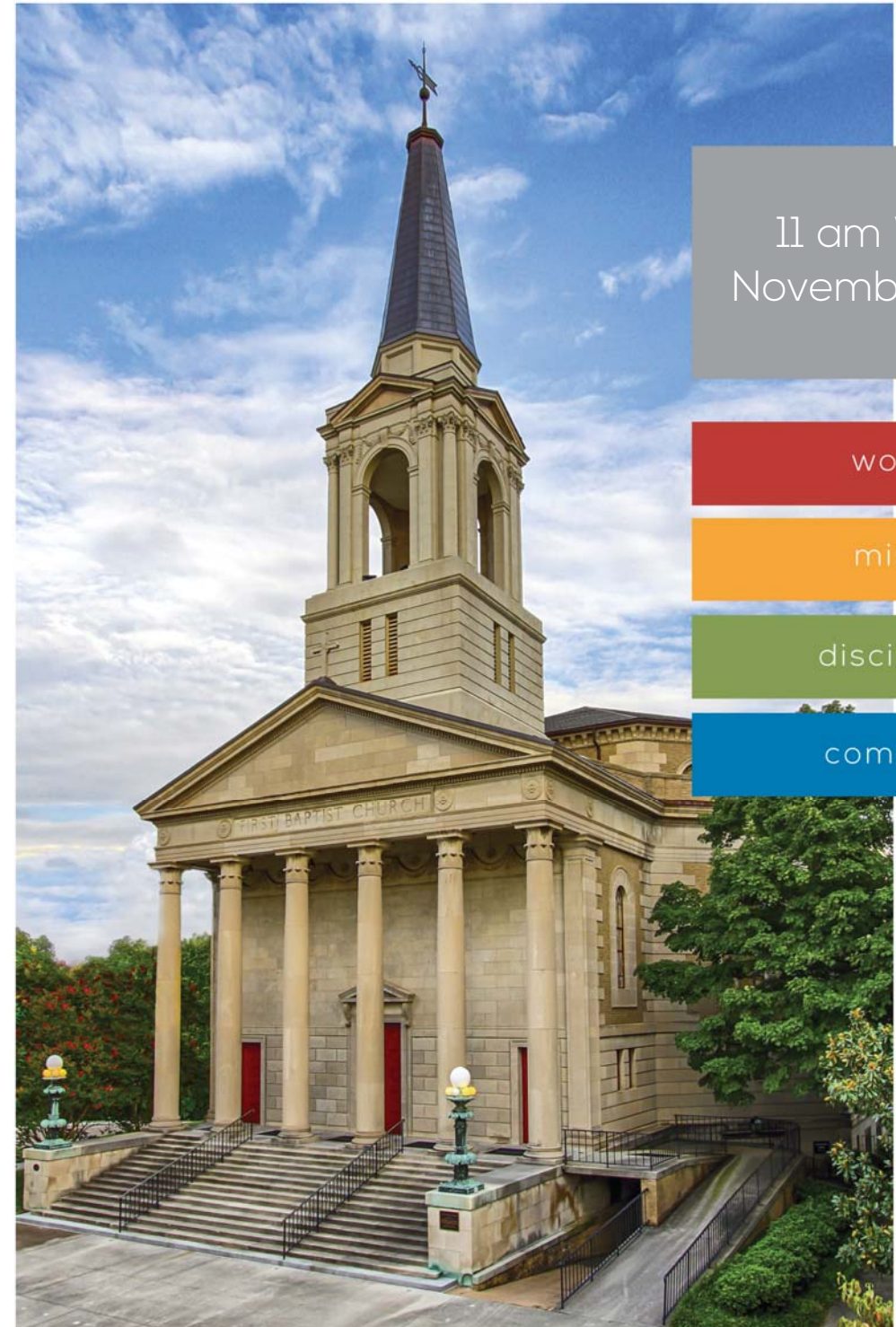
