Becoming a Member

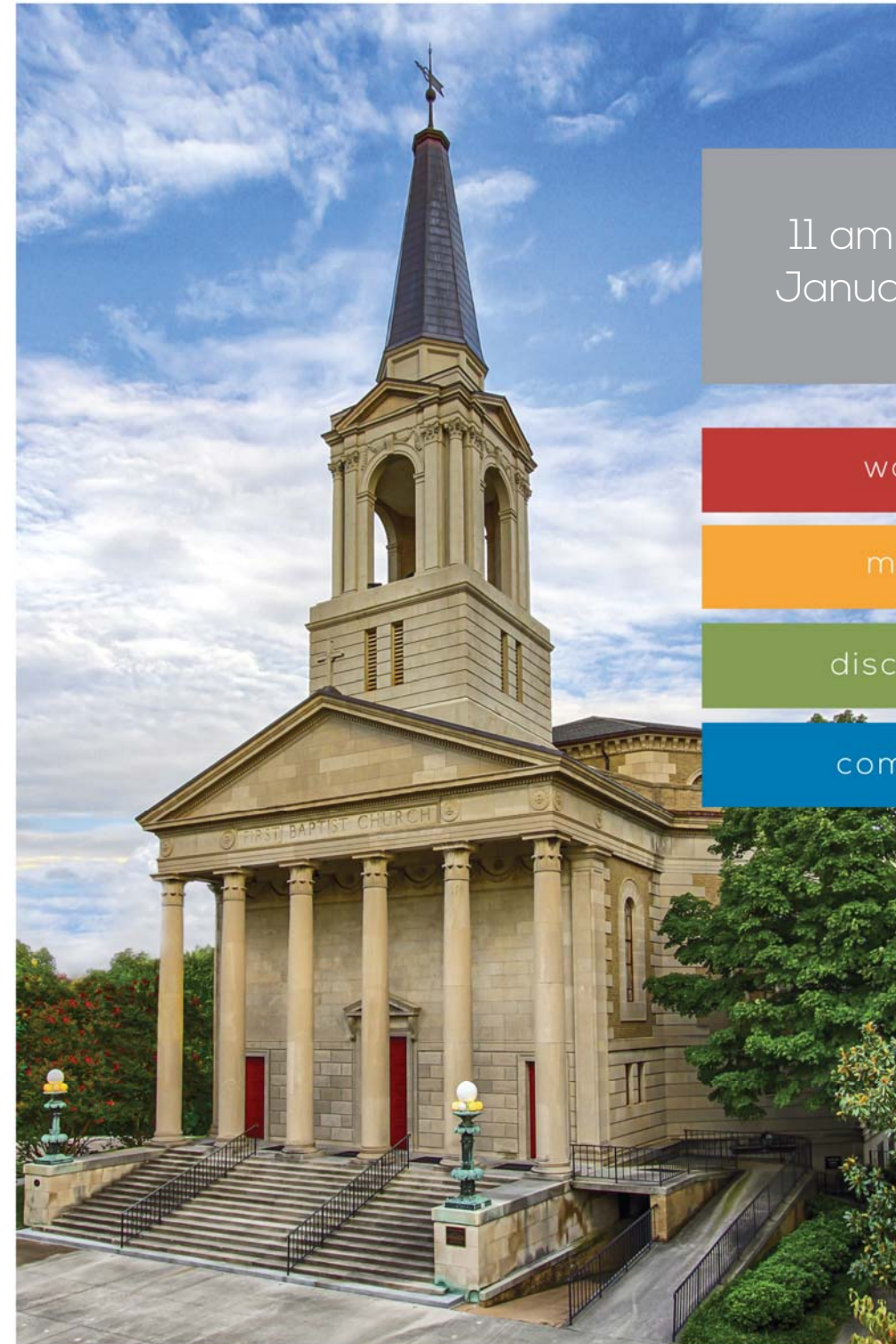
