

### VISION 472

#### Dear Church Family,

The Bible is filled with passages speaking of God-given dreams and visions that helped God's people know what God planned for them. One passage uniquely speaks to God's call for the Church. In the moments following the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the disciples poured from the Upper Room and began to teach and preach in the languages of all present from across the globe. It was an incredible outpouring of the power of God. As Peter preached and tried to help all of those witnessing this work of God understand it, he drew on the words of one of the prophets:

This is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 'In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.' (Acts 2:16-18, NIV)

For the past eight months, a group has been praying, working, and struggling together to help discern how God is at work in our church and where God might be leading us. The group was composed of the current and immediately preceding chair of five councils/committees: Finance – Bob Calloway and Gracie Bishop; Personnel – Mary Ann Dent and Wade Hulsey; Mission – Steve Bowman and Dan Andrews; Long Range Planning – Jim Decker and Alan Tatum; and Deacons – Jim Plemmons and Betty Coley. This group was joined by our ministers: Richard Buerkle, Scott Claybrook, Arthur Clayton, Pam Neal, Tom Ogburn, Susan Tatum, and Ben Winder.

The lay leadership and staff groups first met separately to address big-picture questions. In those meetings we strove to discern what made our church family unique, what defined our church culture, God's purpose in positioning us in this place, and our impact in our community. We talked through challenges that confront us and opportunities ahead.

The groups then came together over five sessions to talk through what they had learned. We sought to hear God speak, dream God's dream for us, and discern God's vision for us. Along the way members of the Visioning Team also reached out to Sunday School classes and engaged people in informal conversations in order to hear how many of you thought God might be directing us. From observations about the church's key commitments to passionate points of future opportunity, the team worked diligently to distill and organize a vision for the future.

Vision 472 is the product of that process. This booklet will break down the plan in three major areas:



**Kingdom Values** – These *four* values represent key pathways to expressing our Christian commitment. We believe these Kingdom Values are common values shared by Christians around the world. As a congregation, however, we express them in ways unique to our heritage, culture, and context. We believe any future God has for us will include these values at its core.



**Congregational Distinctives** – These *seven* distinctives represent recurring places of passion and identity for First Baptist. They serve as places of uniqueness for our congregation. They are distinctive elements – from cultural commitments like the support of women in ministry, to structural commitments like serving as a teaching church – that distinguish us and our sense of place in God's larger Kingdom work. The visioning team has sensed that the distinctives presented here will remain significant commitments in the future.



**Horizon Points** – As the name suggests, these *two* points are places some distance ahead of us. Through the work and discernment of this team, there is a growing sense that these points will serve as a guide for our future mission and ministry in Knoxville and around the world.

While there is a great degree of information contained in these three sections, you may notice some elements are not long. Part of this process has been the visioning team narrowing the focus of First Baptist's future ministry. This is not to say we expect to narrow the impact of First Baptist's future ministry – quite the contrary. By focusing our sense of Kingdom Values, Congregational Distinctives, and Horizon Points our congregation will be able to prepare, equip, and mobilize for the Kingdom work God intends for us.

Embedded within each section of Vision 472 is the acknowledgment that we have been divinely placed in the heart of our city, at the crossroads of its four distinct regional expressions, and on the bounds of a great university. This placement shapes our identity and call. Likewise, the Kingdom call to be disciple-making disciples sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with our community and world lives within the very heart of our church's mission and vision for our future together. Out of our divine placement and sacred call we step into a future hope in Christ Jesus.

We, as a congregation, are fortunate to have deep reservoirs of leadership, heritage, resources, and passion. We are able to do a great deal of ministry, yet we are also but one congregation in the broader Kingdom. We believe, therefore, that our work has been to discern where and how God will use us as a piece in God's broad, redemptive work.



- An embrace of a mission strategy which is streamlined and concentrated for enduring relationships

We are called to become a congregation committed to redemptive ministries as expressed through marriage ministries; engagement in adoption, foster care and Safe Families ministries; parenting ministries; and other ministries designed to strengthen and restore individuals and families.

- Formation of a ministry plan designed to strengthen and restore marriages and family units
- Partnerships with local agencies in areas such as Safe Families, foster care, and adoption
- Meaningful engagement with individuals and families in crisis
- Expanded resources and aid for those caring for aging loved ones
- Cultivation of efforts to include and engage single adults in ministry
