DWELL NIGHT OF WORSHIP



Starting in August, we will introduce a new monthly worship opportunity: the Dwell Night of Worship. This once-a-month gathering will be tailored for our First Baptist college students and young adults. Over the last year, we've seen exponential growth in our Dwell Young Adult Ministry, and we want to channel that growth into an opportunity for communal worship and discipleship. Our young adults are called to minister throughout Knoxville and our community, as are all of us, and these nights of worship will allow them to gather together, connect, and grow as called disciples of Christ.

"Since the earliest days of the Church, worship has served to connect and catalyze the body of Christ. Worship both renews the soul and creates the possibility for God to both speak and transform those present. As our young adult ministry continues to grow, we want to provide new ways for our young adults to connect with one another and be equipped for Kingdom work," says Scott Claybrook.

The service will take place in Trentham Hall on the third Sunday of each month at 5 pm. Richard Buerkle will provide overarching leadership for the music and worship elements. As part of our commitment to being a "Teaching Church," Richard will work to mentor and coach young adults, enabling them to lead participants in worship. Scott Claybrook will be the primary teacher for the gatherings.

These monthly gatherings will be offered to young adults as an additional worship experience meant as a compliment to First Baptist's Sunday morning services. They will create a space to experiment and explore old and new forms of worship, providing an avenue for our young adults to experience a transformative encounter with God. Communion will be offered every service, along with other elements centered upon art, prayer, writing, and other creative forms of worship.

We are glad to announce this addition to our worship opportunities, and we are excited to see where our Dwell Young Adult Ministry goes from here. Below are the worship dates for the fall:

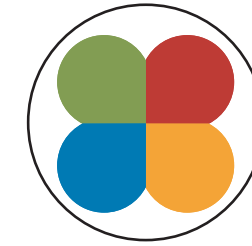
