VBS 2017: IT'S THE LITTLE THINGS



avid was a little man, but like the bible says, little people can do big things." This was 7 year old Zion Kariuki's answer when his First Baptist VBS teacher asked the class why God chose David, rather than his other brothers to be king. His words perfectly embody this year's VBS theme: Hero Central.

At first, the words Hero Central sound like they describe superpowers. Hero Central, however, taught the children to focus on extending God's love to others in everyday ways.

"What we wanted the kids to understand," says VBS Director Susan Tatum, "was that God does not give us magical powers like the superheroes on TV. God gives us the ability to have heart, courage, wisdom, hope, and love, and those are characteristics of true heroes."

Over 100 children and 80 volunteers embraced those five characteristics last week, and it made for a completely unique VBS experience with the highest attendance Susan has seen in her 11 years at First Baptist. The children practiced these God-given characteristics through words and deeds of kindness called God Sightings. Susan reports the children were overflowing with love for each other and for their teachers.

"Children are amazing to each other and to adults. These kids thanked their small group and rotation leaders for what they've done. That sticks out. Just a little gesture like holding the door for your entire class... For a four year old to understand that is showing God's love, is amazing to me. It's the little things. And sometimes you wonder if the younger ones get it. And they do. They get it."

This year, VBS challenged us as a body to be heroes by investing in the little things – investing in these little people who can do great things in great love. We want to thank everyone who accepted the challenge. To the youth and college students who took time out of their busy weeks to lead classes – we are thankful. To those who were willing to pray, bring food, park cars, teach classes, chase children, dress up as Bible characters – we are thankful. We could not have made this important outreach work without your help.
