n the first few years of being an established church, First Baptist members coined the phrase: In the Center of the City With the Saviour. Today we have adapted a new version: Becoming the People of God, In the City, For the City. God put us in the city on purpose, and we are thrilled to celebrate 175 years of following God into the unknown for his glory.

That is what the Kick-Off Celebration will be all about. We'll take an intentional look back at our past then take an intentional step forward into our future. We see this mirrored in the Bible when God commands Joshua and the Israelites to erect 12 stones in remembrance of what God had done for them. Then, God has them leave the stones, turn, and enter into the promise land. Throughout it all, God iterates over and over to be strong and courageous for they are about to experience something they never have before. We believe God is asking the same of us.

So, on January 21, we will kick off a year of intentionally thanking God for being faithful and taking the next steps into what God has for us. Here is how the celebration on the 21st will go:

Restrooms are located in the hallway directly behind the choir loft.


