WHEN WE WERE CALLED KNOXVILLE BAPTIST CHURCH BY LINDA WALSH



noxville Baptist Church (appropriately renamed First Baptist) was organized in January 1843 at the Court House, where church services were held. With 47 charter members, the church received support from Baptists in Exeter, NH, original home of the two church founders (the Moses brothers). In September 1843, the church had 80 members.

By 1844, plans were underway to build a church house. Completed in 1850, the church was located on Gay Street, where the Arcade Building is today. From March 1850 until September 1852, the church was without a regular minister. Membership declined; and because of debt, the building was almost auctioned off. However, with a new minister, the church grew to 91 members by 1854. Although the membership by 1860 is uncertain, committees were clearly part of church life. Records from 1860 reflect the Steeple Committee's concern about the church's leaking steeple; the same year, the first church covenant was adopted.

According to Knoxville historian Jack Neely, "Knoxville in 1853 seemed like the sort of place where something was about to happen" Much did happen in Knoxville during the remainder of the decade. An 1853 news article anticipated Knoxville's future: "... prosperity, greatness, and glory await this ancient metropolis."

Developments included the beginning of Market Square; the railroad's arrival; the opening of Immaculate Conception, the first Catholic church in East Tennessee; the installation of gas street lights and cobblestones on Gay Street; and the growth of manufacturing. Between 1850 and 1860, Knoxville's population grew from 2,076 to 5,300.

Thus, the antebellum years were significant for the Baptist church on Gay Street and the burgeoning city. Beginning in 1861, however, the winds of war brought devastation.
